GENERAL CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS

1. Every exhibit in Livestock classes, except ewe lambs, must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor for not less than two months previous to and on the day of the Exhibition.
2. All entries must be made on the appropriate forms and submitted to the Secretary, not later than the closing date.
3. Exhibitors who have not paid their entry fees shall not be entitled to compete for prizes.
4. Exhibitors are required to provide accurate information regarding their entries on request.
5. No second prize will be given in any class unless three entries or more are exhibited. The Society reserve the right to cancel any event for which there are insufficient entries.
6. Neither the Society, nor any of its officers or servants shall in any way be responsible or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstance whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants, or any animals or article exhibited, or property brought into the Show, or otherwise for anything else in connection with or arising out of or attributable to the Society's Show.
7. All livestock, implements, etc. exhibited and all servants in charge of them, will be subject to the orders and rules of the Management Committee, or the officers appointed by them. Owners of animals exhibited will be held responsible for the behaviour of their servants, and for the consequences of any misconduct of such servants. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him, and for its description as given in the catalogue; and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.
8. Admission tickets will be sent to exhibitors prior to the Show. Attendants **cannot** obtain **free admission** to the show unless such a ticket is produced. The number of tickets allocated to exhibitors will be based, pro rata, on their total number of entries.
9. **Arrival and General Departure of Stock.** All exhibits of livestock must be on the Showground by 9.00 a.m. on Monday, 29th August, 2011, except where otherwise stated. All livestock and produce must remain in their places in the Showground until 4.30 p.m. on the evening of August 29th, and as long as the Stewards consider necessary. The carriage of exhibits must in all cases be paid by the exhibitor.
10. **Challenge Cups** to be held for one year.
11. **Disease.** Every exhibitor of livestock shall forfeit and pay to the Society the sum of £50, for liquidation damages, if any animal which he exhibits is to his knowledge suffering under any contagious or infectious disease, and for such and every animal if more than one.
12. **The Committee request that all sheep are treated with a scab approved product at least 14 days prior to the show.**

CONDITIONS APPLYING TO PARTICULAR CLASSES

SHEPHERDS: 'Hired Shepherd' is a Shepherd who is employed full-time for wages by an employer other than his parents or other relatives. Their stock to be drawn from their own pack or from their employer's hirsell.

THE SHEEP CLASSES ARE OPEN: All entries must comply with orders and regulations under Diseases of Animals Acts current at the time of the Show.

NOTE: Suffolk, Texel, Zwartble, Any Other Continental and Native entries must be from fully M.V. accredited flocks and will be provided with approved penning. All other sections will be in non-accredited accommodation. All sheep entered in M.V. only classes must be accompanied by a valid Certificate of Official MV Status which has been correctly completed and **presented before they are unloaded**.

All Ewes shall have reared lambs in 2011.

PROTESTS

No protest against any exhibitor or the awards of the Judges will in any case be entertained if made after the decisions are given and the distinguishing tickets attached to the prize animals, unless such protest applies to fraudulent entry or description. Every protest must be delivered to the Secretary at the office on the Showfield before 1.00 p.m. on the day of the show, and accompanied by a deposit of £20.

The Management Committee of the Society shall hear the evidence by which such protest is entered, and also the evidence offered by the exhibitor, and decide upon the same, and in all cases their decision is final.

In cases where such protest shall be deemed frivolous or unsupported by evidence, the deposit shall, at the discretion of the Council, be forfeited to the funds of the Society.

All exhibitors and persons admitted into the Show shall be subject to the Rules, Orders and Regulations of the Management Committee.

TRADE STANDS

All reservations for Trade Stand space should be made as early as possible and not later **than 31st May, 2011**. Stands are single fronted, minimum 8 metres depth or double fronted, minimum 16 metres depth. Single fronted stands are charged at £15 per metre + VAT with a minimum charge of £60 for a frontage of 4 metres or less. Double fronted are charged at £30 per metre + VAT with a minimum charge of £180 for a frontage of 6 metres or less. Agricultural machinery and/or Vehicle Sales are usually accommodated on double fronted stands. **Remittance must be received before 30th June, 2011.**

The Committee reserve the right to reject any application for space and to return the fees or otherwise deal with the application as they may consider advisable.

EXHIBITORS: Exhibitors of implements etc. shall be entitled to a description of their exhibits in the Society's Catalogue free of charge.

Showmen exhibitors, etc., who offer rides to the public must produce entirely valid Showmen's Guild Insurances when requested, to fully cover any claims against themselves or the Glendale Agricultural Society.

A full list of Regulations are laid out in the Application for Trade Stand Space and should be adhered to at all times.

The kidding dates for all goats in milk must be quoted. All goats in milk must be kidded or aborted a minimum of 30 days previous to the day of the Show. Separate penning will be provided for exhibits from CAE Monitored herds. Blood test results bearing a date within twelve months of this show must accompany entries. These negative results must be on BGS submission form or Sheep and Goat Health Scheme forms.

HORTICULTURAL AND INDUSTRIAL RULES

1. The Society will be known as 'The Horticultural and Industrial Committee of The Glendale Show'.
2. They shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Patrons, Secretaries, Treasurer and Committee who shall be elected annually, and of two classes of members--Honorary and Ordinary.
3. All Exhibitors paying £4 and over will receive one Ticket of Admission to the Show. Children under 16 years of age will be admitted on payment of 50p each, to exhibit in all Children's Classes free.
4. Exhibitors and Members of this Society will have to pay an entrance fee of 10p for each entry. ONE ENTRY PER CLASS.
5. Each Exhibitor, previous to placing any article for competition, shall sign a declaration that the productions exhibited for prizes are bona-fide his own growth, and that they have been in his possession at least two months previous to the day of the Show. His garden must also be open for inspection by the Committee. If any Exhibitor does not conform to the declaration signed, or uses any deception with his flowers etc, the Committee, upon the facts being made known to them, shall have it in their power to withhold any prize that may have been awarded and such Exhibitor shall subject himself to expulsion. Any person objecting to any exhibit as not conforming to this Rule must state his objection in writing by 3 p.m. to the Secretary.
6. Competent judges will be appointed by the committee, and their decision shall in every case be final. Should the judges consider the best exhibit in any class unworthy of a prize, no prize will be awarded.
7. Exhibitors and their assistants only shall be allowed to enter the place of Exhibition during the time of setting up the flowers, etc. The Marquees to be opened for that purpose at 7.30 a.m. and all exhibits must be staged by 10 a.m. The tent will be open as soon as the judging is finished and closed at 4.45 p.m. Re-open at 5 p.m. when the exhibits may be removed.
8. Forms of entry may be had from the Secretary, and the list of entries must be returned to the Secretary not later than the Wednesday before the Show.
9. The Committee shall manage the general business of the Society, and no alteration or addition to the foregoing rules shall be made but at the Annual Meeting.
10. Every care will be taken with the exhibits but the Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.
11. A General Meeting of the members shall be held annually at Wooler on the second Tuesday in October at 7.30 p.m. for the purpose of electing the Office Bearers for the ensuing year and for the transaction of other business appertaining to the Society.
12. Once an exhibit has been staged it must not be removed to another class. A whistle will blow at 9.50 a.m. and at 10 a.m. to clear the tent.
13. Definition of a Novice a competitor who has not won a 1st prize at a previous show.
